

MANCHESTER COMMUNITY COLLEGE SETS SUMMER ENROLLMENT RECORD!

MANCHESTER—Summer enrollment at Manchester Community College is at record levels, up 14 percent over last year's summer term opening day, and just over 18% over summer 2008's final tally.

This is the college's third consecutive semester of record enrollments.

While both day and evening class enrollments are up, the highest percentage of increase is in MCC's online classes. "Of the classes that are completely full, half are online," says MCC President Darlene Miller. "Students are taking advantage of the flexibility of earning college credits on their own schedule, rather than having to be on campus at a specific day and time.

"These numbers show that increasing numbers of students have discovered Manchester Community College," Miller continues. "With their tight finances, they're taking advantage of our high quality and affordable education, whether they're looking for credits to transfer to a four-year college or professional training to begin or advance their career.

"Students have discovered Manchester Community College as a key to their future."

In addition to the term which started May 26, MCC offers a second summer term which begins June 22nd. The college also runs a number of non-credit skills training courses; those run throughout the year.
